
On September 26, 1980, Sharon Gaffney was elected homecoming queen by her peers, the Senior class of 1981.


















"Here's Love"

I have many fond memories of Finland that will be with me always. I hope to always keep in touch with my family and friends there. I would like to thank the A.F.S. for sending me to Finland.




